

# JESUS, WE ADORE YOU - GINNY OWENS



Ginny Owens' unique musical style and inspirational lyrics have transcended genre definition, endearing her to Christian and mainstream listeners internationally. The Gospel Music Association named Owens New Artist of the Year in 2000, and the songstress went on to receive two additional Dove Awards, sold more than a million albums, received song placements in both feature films and television shows, and had a string of radio hits, including career-defining No. 1 hit singles like "If You Want Me To" and "Free." She has also penned songs for other artists, including Michael W. Smith, and has performed for audiences at the White House, Sundance Film Festival, Lilith Fair and the 60th annual National Day of Prayer in Washington, D.C. In addition to her career in music, Owens is a speaker, blogger, and co-author of *Transcending Mysteries: Who Is God And What Does He Want From Us*.

Award-winning singer-songwriter Ginny Owens re-releases her acclaimed Christmas EP, *The Greatest Gift*, Dec. 9 on her indie label, Chick Power Music, with The Fuel Music distribution. First released last fall, the acclaimed EP features three original tracks, including the newly added song, current radio single and lyric video, "Jesus, We Adore You."

## Philippians 2:5-11, New International Version (NIV)

- <sup>5</sup> In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:  
<sup>6</sup> Who, being in very nature God,  
did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;  
<sup>7</sup> rather, he made himself nothing  
by taking the very nature of a servant,  
being made in human likeness.  
<sup>8</sup> And being found in appearance as a man,  
he humbled himself  
by becoming obedient to death—  
even death on a cross!  
<sup>9</sup> Therefore God exalted him to the highest place  
and gave him the name that is above every name,
